
Alessio went on the tour as travelling trainer with our professionals in many occasions: German Prize Money tournaments, ITF (junior and professionals) and ATP Challengers.

The physical work, result of everyday briefings with us for getting the maximum performance with the technical work, let all our players to get remarkable and constant improvements all season long. His full-time presence on the court, also during tennis trainings, allowed the development of a personal method specific for each one athlete. In this way each player could fill his own gaps in the way of moving and getting the right physical attitude on the court, so they could get more confidence on their own power points.


